

Girl detectives in children's fiction go back a long way, with perhaps the most notable name from the past being Nancy Drew, about whom the first book in a long series was published in 1930. In recent years there has been an increasing trend in stories featuring girl detectives, with series by Robin Stevens and Katherine Woodfine leading the way. There is now a range of stories with a variety of historical and contemporary settings. This list presents a guide to these, comprising three sections. The first focuses on titles suitable for readers in lower KS2. This is followed by a historical cases section which is in chronological order, from the Vikings to the 1930s and finally, crimes with contemporary settings.

Stories for junior sleuths



Betsey Biggalow the Detective by Malorie Blackman, illustrated by Jamie Smith

In one of the four stories in this book for younger readers Betsey Biggalow is inspired to turn detective by a book about Sam, the girl detective, and find out what has happened to her missing teddy bear Slinky Malinky. The detective TV series her Gran'ma Liz likes gives her the idea for the associated accoutrements of deerstalker hat and magnifying glass.




Stick & Fetch Investigate. Barking Up the Wrong Tree by Philip Ardagh and Elissa Elwick

Sally Stick and her canine companion Fetch are detectives. They are always on the lookout for cases to solve. There are continual misunderstandings about what mysteries need resolving and this gets them into some surprising and potentially sticky situations.

Mariella Mystery Investigates: The Ghostly Guinea Pig by Kate Pankhurst Orion 9781444008883

With names like Mariella Mystery, Poppy Holmes and Violet Maple (not Marple, but close!) these three girls were destined to be detectives. Their first case begins when their teacher Miss Crumble thinks she has seen the ghost of her recently deceased guinea pig in her garden. The book is designed to look like a diary set out in a notebook and there are top tips for detectives scattered throughout. First in a series that numbers eight titles.



Dotty Detective by Clara Vulliamy HarperCollins 9780008132491


Dotty starts at a new school and quickly makes friends with Beans who also loves the Fred Fantastic TV detective series. Their first case involves finding out about and foiling the plans of Laura who seems determined to undermine the efforts of their classmate Amy in a school talent show. The story is set out as a diary and includes lots of appealing visual details. First in a series of six titles.



Judy Moody, Girl Detective by Megan McDonald, illustrated by Peter H. Reynolds

Inspired by her reading of the Nancy Drew books, Judy Moody focuses on seeking out and solving everyday mysteries in her school and community. Then Officer Kopp's dog Mr Chips disappears and Judy becomes agent Liz Inkwell, aka Judy Drewdy, WBMS (World's Best Mystery Solver) in a bid to bring him back.




Precious and the Monkeys by Alexander McCall Smith, illustrated by Iain McIntosh

When a precious pearl belonging to Violet Remy-Robinson's neighbour, former starlet Dee Dee Derota, goes missing, Violet is suspicious of their new neighbours Count and Countess Du Plicitous and their daughter, Isabella. The illustrations bring out the humour in the telling of this adventure and their shades of colour complement our heroine's name. Agent Zaiba Investigates. The Missing Diamonds by Annabelle Sami, illustrated by Daniela Sosa Stripes 9781788952064

Zaiba and her family are at the Royal Star Hotel for her cousin Samirah's premarriage Mehndi party. However, when a celebrity guest arrives at the hotel whose pampered pooch temporarily disappears and is found minus his very valuable collar, it's a cue for Zaiba and her team, comprising her little brother Ali and her friend Poppy, to try and crack the case. Zaiba is aided by her intimate knowledge of *Eden Lockett's Detective Handbook* which accompanies her favourite series of mystery stories. The fact that Zaiba's Aunt Fouzia heads up the Snow Leopard Detective Agency in Pakistan is a help too!


Riddle of the Runes. A Viking Mystery by Janina Ramirez, illustrated by David Wyatt

Alva 'is a keen investigator and can seek clues and unpick riddles like no other in Kilsgard'. So says her well-travelled Uncle Magnus. The arrival in their village of a monk from Lindisfarne bearing a mysterious casket covered with symbols that need deciphering leads Alva and Magnus, accompanied by Alva's faithful wolf Fenrir (named after the son of the Norse god Loki) to embark on a dangerous adventure. Will they be able to solve the mystery that appears to be connected to Alva's father Bjorn who has not returned from his latest voyage a-Viking? An appendix has information about the runes they must interpret along the way.

The Diamond of Drury Lane by Julia Golding Egmont 9781405285308


It's 1790 and Cat Royal lives in the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane where Mr Sheridan, playwright, politician and theatre owner is her guardian. Streetwise Cat becomes embroiled in a mystery concerning a diamond which she believes is concealed somewhere in the theatre. The chapters are headed as though they are acts and scenes in a play and the novel has a terrific cast of characters headed by Cat herself. They include Pedro Hawkins, a gifted African violinist and performer and former slave, and Johnny Smith, new prompter at the theatre who is a man with a secret.



The Case of the Missing Moonstone. The Wollstonecraft Detective Agency by Jordan Stratford, illustrated by Kelly Murphy Corgi Yearling 9780440871163

Set in 1826, some literary licence allows two not quite contemporary characters from history to work together. Ada Byron, brilliant and irascible mathematician and scientist, and Mary Godwin, avid reader and seeker after romance and adventure, meet when they are tutored by a certain Percy Shelley. Realising that there are crimes that go unsolved, they start the Wollstonecraft Detective Agency, named in honour of Mary's late mother. Biographical notes at the end of the book explain some truths about the real people who inspired the characters.

Rose Campion and the Stolen Secret by Lyn Gardner, illustrated by Júlia Sardà Nosy Crow 9780857634863

Starting in a Yorkshire village and swiftly moving to Victorian Southwark and a music hall known as Campion's Palace of Variety and Wonders, the characters and plot of this story have a Dickensian feel. Rose and her new companions Aurora and Effie have to unravel a mystery involving abandoned babies, mistaken identity and associated skullduggery.




Rose Raventhorpe Investigates: Black Cats and Butlers by Janine Beacham Little, Brown 9781510201286

The murder of several butlers including her own beloved Argyle, combined with the disappearance of cat statues around the city, set Rose Raventhorpe off on an investigative trail in this gothic mystery set in Victorian times. The butlers turn out to be a brotherhood protecting a City of Yorke that bears more than a passing resemblance to the real city of York but in a slightly sideways universe and the presence of the cat statues is based on a local legend.



Diamonds and Deception. A Verity Sparks Mystery by Susan Green Walker 9781406371734

In 1878 Verity Sparks moves from being an Apprentice Milliner to an Assistant Confidential Inquiry Agent when she is falsely accused of stealing jewellery and subsequently taken up by the well-to-do Plush family. Verity has a special skill in being able to recover missing objects but the big mystery surrounds her own origins.



The Mystery of the Clockwork Sparrow by Katherine Woodfine Egmont 9781405276177

Sophie and Lil work, as a salesgirl and a model respectively, at the magnificent Sinclairs department store in Edwardian London which is about to open with great fanfare. When the priceless Clockwork Sparrow goes missing, Sophie is under suspicion. As the pace of the story mounts will Sophie and Lil, along with apprentice porter Billy and fugitive Joe be able to solve the mystery and avert a much greater disaster? The atmosphere of the era is beautifully evoked, especially the interior of the store and the elegant fashions. When a girl who appears to be her cousin Ida, who disappeared at the age of two, arrives at the home she shares with her two aunts and step uncle in South Kensington, Connie Carew is suspicious about her real identity and sets out to discover the truth. Set in 1909, the manners and mores of the time are well evoked in this absorbing mystery.

The Rose Muddle Mysteries. The Amber Pendant by Imogen White Usborne 9781474927291


Rose is mysteriously chosen from the workhouse to become a maid in the home of Miss Templeforth where she soon discovers that she is destined to inherit an ancient amber pendant from her employer. Rose rapidly becomes embroiled in a dangerous adventure, accompanied by Rui Singh, recently arrived from India. Aided and abetted by the monkey Bahula, can they foil the plans of the Brotherhood of the Black Sun? A story with a strong sense of place in Edwardian Hove. The Catacombs of Chaos by Dan Metcalf, illustrated by Rachelle Panagarry Bloomsbury 9781512481853


The first of the Lottie Lipton Adventures featuring a girl detective who lives in the British Museum in the 1920s where she solves mysteries relating to objects in the museum. Each book include puzzles for readers to solve and some tantalising historical facts.

Nancy Parker's Diary of Detection by Julia Lee, illustrated by Chloe Bonfield Oxford University Press 9780192739384


In a post-World War One world, Nancy Parker leaves school at 14 and begins work as a housemaid, in preference to taking up a job in the local biscuit factory. However, what she would most like to be is a detective and her new post affords her the opportunity as she suspects that her employer Mrs Bryce and her dashing filmmaker friend Guy Gommershall may not be all that they seem. The text alternates between Nancy's journal and a third person narrative bringing in her new acquaintances Ella Mary Otter, a professor's daughter, and Quentin Ives, aka John Horsefield, the vicar's pupil. Murder Most Unladylike by Robin Stevens Corgi 9780141369761


The first in a series set in a 1930s boarding school with all the trapping of girls' school stories of the period from midnight feasts to the relationships engendered by living in such a closely knit community. When Hazel Wong, secretary of the Wells & Wong Detective Society, discovers the body of Science mistress Miss Bell, she and her friend Daisy Wells embark on their first serious case. The book comes complete with a plan of Deepdean School reminiscent of Cluedo and frequently revised lists of suspects and their possible motives. After an unfortunate incident at her old school, Daphne Blakeway is offered a place at St Rita's School for Spirited Girls. Her involvement in adventure begins even before she arrives when she is handed a book called *Scarlet Fury:* A Smeeton Westerby Mystery on the train and told it is for the school library. Daphne is recruited as Assistant to the Assistant Librarian, the redoubtable Emily Lime and is soon embroiled in solving a mystery when there is a breakin at the school. There is much fun to be had in a story that plays with the traditional features of the girls' boarding school story and the illustrations are reminiscent of such stories in comics.


A collection of twelve short stories, many of them written by authors represented in this booklist. Katherine Woodfine provides an introduction in which she points out that the recent explosion in these books 'nods to the much-loved mysteries of the past, but also bring detective fiction bang up to date'. Divided into four sections 'Impossible Mysteries', 'Canine Capers', 'Poison Plots' and 'Closed-System Crimes'.

The Marsh Road Mysteries: Diamonds and Diggers by Elen Caldecott Bloomsbury 9781408847527


A small band of girls and boys solve a mystery surrounding a missing necklace in a story in the Enid Blyton tradition with a denouement reminiscent of *Emil and the Detectives*. However, this is set firmly in the 21st century with smart girls Minnie and Flora leading the investigation to help their friend Piotr whose dad is accused of theft, making him disillusioned with British life and wanting to take his family back to Poland. Fast moving with plenty of comic moments, the central characters are convincingly drawn and placed in a multicultural, multi-faceted urban setting.




The Great Shelby Holmes. Girl Detective by Elizabeth Eulberg, illustrated by Matt Robertson



Laura Marlin has lived in a children's home all her life until she is suddenly sent to live with an uncle she has never met in St Ives. Cue for much mystery including a creepy housekeeper and a sinister shopkeeper. And what secret is Uncle Calvin hiding? The combination of fast paced plots and domestic details enables readers to believe in the hair-raising situations in which Laura and her friend Tariq find themselves. The Cornish seaside setting is strongly evoked in the first book and in the follow up (also included in this volume) aquatic environmental issues in the Caribbean come to the fore. 


Kat Wolfe Investigates (Wolfe and Lamb) by Lauren St John, illustrated by Beidi Guo






Agatha Oddly. The Secret Key by Lena Jones HarperCollins 9780008211837

Agatha Oddlow has always considered herself to be a detective and often shares her thoughts with the fictional Hercule Poirot. She has the opportunity to take on her first big case when she sees a hit-and-run incident involving an old lady. Was it an accident? When the woman's business card reveals that she is a Hydrology expert at the Royal Geographical Society and seemingly coincidentally there is a mysterious outbreak of serious pollution in London's water, Agatha suspects there is a connection. The London locations — including Hyde Park where Agatha's father is Head Gardener - are well evoked. This series is produced by a syndicate of writers, just like the Nancy Drew and Hardy Boys mysteries!



High Rise Mystery by Sharna Jackson Knights Of 9781999642518

Nik and her older sister Norva live on an estate known as The Tri. When they find the dead body of Hugo Knightley-Webb, they immediately put into practice their detective skills, using the formula 'facts, evidence, deduction' — methodological and procedural, just like the detectives they have seen on TV. However, that's complicated when the victim is a neighbour and your dad is the chief suspect. Told from Nik's point of view in short sentences and using authentic dialogue, this is promised to be just the first of a series featuring this detective duo of black sisters.



Lori and Max by Catherine O'Flynn Firefly 9781913102029

This contemporary crime novel opens with Lori hearing that her friend Maxine (known as Max) is missing. The action then backtracks three months to the day Max first arrived at New Heath Primary and moves forward with different chapters being narrated in the first person by Lori and in the third person describing what is happening to Max. Max's disappearance is initially assumed to be linked to some missing money. Lori's detective skills and the resilience and ingenuity of both girls lead to a resolution.



The Cure for a Crime by Roopa Farooki Oxford University Press 9780192773593

In the first Double Detectives Medical Mystery, twins Ali and Tulip investigate who or what is causing a strange sleepy-sickness that their doctor mother has and which seems to be spreading. Is her new boyfriend Sturgeon involved? The girls are helped along by their Nan-Nan who has a mysterious past. A nice addition to the book is an appendix referred to intermittently throughout the story which incorporates the Bristol Stool Chart among other Twintermissions.
