



Year 1 Curriculum

Spring Term

Nurturing Potential Within a Christian Ethos

Maths

This term we will be focussing on Addition and Subtraction within 20 and Place Value within 50. We will be moving on to Length and Height and Weight and Volume.

English

This term we will be practising our Narrative Skills by re-telling stories from contemporary authors, creating and describing characters and describing settings in the style of an author. We will also be Writing to Inform, through writing recounts and instructions.

Science

This term we will be focussing on Animals, including Humans, specifically learning about our 5 senses. We will then move on to Seasonal Changes.

R.E.

We will be focusing on these 2 key questions: Does Creation help people understand God? Should everyone follow Jesus?

P.E.

The skills for this term are ball skills (football), cross country, yoga and dance. We will use these skills to take part in sporting events with other local schools, including a cross country competition.

Computing

This term we will be learning how to log on to a computer, as well as Creating Media, through Digital Painting. The children will be creating a picture, and explain why they chose the tools that they used.

Music

A piece of music called 'Finlandia' by Jean Sibelius is going to be our focus for this term. The children will be creating their own version of Sibelius's music.

P.S.H.E.

The focus will be 'Living in the Wider World', where we look at what rules are, using the internet and digital devices and our individual strengths and interests.

Art

We will be focussing on drawing skills, including lines, marks, shape and tone. We will be experimenting with a variety of media; pencils, rubbers, crayons, pastels, felt tips and charcoal. We will create a Picasso style drawing by the end of this term.

DT will be a focus in the Summer Term.

Humanities

This half term, we are learning about Captain Scott, as part of History. Next half term, we will focus on Geography, looking at the location of hot and cold areas of the world.
