

Year 3 Curriculum Spring Term

Nurturing Potential Within a Christian Ethos

Maths

We will be learning how to multiply and divide 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers.

We will also develop our money skills, practising adding and subtracting with coins and notes.

R.E.

We are learning about Hinduism and the beliefs in this faith. We will also be comparing elements of Hinduism to other faiths.

Music

We are listening to and learning the song Lean on Me. We are focussing on pulse and rhythm and looking at the structure of the song and how it compares to others.

D.T.

We are taking inspiration from the Romans by designing and making our own form of Roman footwear using a variety of different materials.

English

This term we are Reading The Water Horse. We will be developing skills to write a missing chapter and our own adventure story. We will also be looking at writing to persuade and non fiction writing.

P.E.

We are developing our fitness levels – focussing particularly on strength, speed, agility and balance. We will be doing different activities and exercises to develop these different skills

P.S.H.E.

We are learning about our rights and responsibilities and how they are linked.

We will also be looking at how to use the internet safely and recognise that many things can be altered on the internet and are not always real.

MFL

In French we will begin by learning the names of the colours. We will then move on to the topic of food including the traditional French food – Crêpes!

Science

This half term we are learning about Forces and Magnets.

We will be exploring pushes and pulls and the properties of magnets through a variety of investigations.

Computing

We are creating stop motion animations using imotion on the iPads.

Art

We are learning the techniques of shading and toning to add light and shadow to our sketches. We will use clay to create our own pots in the style of Roman pottery.

Humanities

This half term we will learn about the Roman invasion of Britain, the features of Roman towns and houses and what finally brought the Roman Empire to an end.
