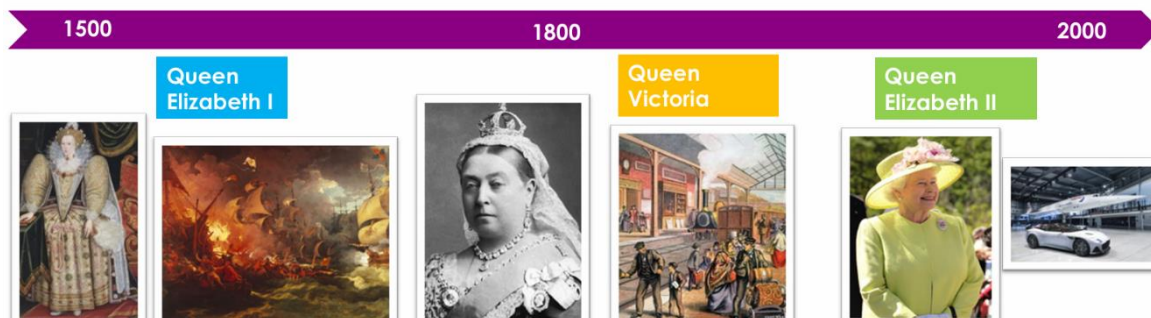

Queen Victoria unexpectedly became queen at the age of just 18. After her much-loved husband, Albert, died when she was just 42, she wore black clothes for the rest of her life.
